Our New Topic This Half Term: Rainforests.



We have also begun our new class read: The Explorer by Katherine Rundell. The children have been researching the author and exploring the new vocabulary that this book presents.


As part of our geography map work we have recapped the continents and explored where rainforests are found around the world; looking for patterns in our findings.

Celebrating Diversity




Proud to be yourself
