### **Infants**

The Infants have been thoroughly enjoying the current farming topic. We're very fortunate to have our very own resident dairy farmer in the class and she has loved telling us all about what life is like on a working farm.

We have designed wanted posters for Lanky Len and Hefty Hugh from 'What the Ladybird Heard' and some of the children went on to design a farm where the animals could be safe.

## **Junior Class**

In English the junior class have been exploring the language and structural features of information texts. Are texts so far have been about different kinds of mythical creatures. The children have created and filmed interviews with dragon experts to gather and provide information on these mystical creatures.

In maths we continue our unit on fractions. Children have been working with equivalent fractions; some of the class have been using multiplication and division to find fractions in their simplest form. Year 3s have been adding fractions and subtracting from 1 whole. All children have becoming much more confident in their fraction work!

Our topic focus was been geography this week. The children have been looking at the continents of the world and identifying the key countries in each. We have also been exploring different crops and where they are produced in the world.
